**Minutes of the Chapter General Membership Meeting
Wednesday, May 27, 2009, 12 Noon
Manhattan Steakhouse – Guam Marriott Resort**

1. Call to Order: President Rodalyn Marquez called the meeting to order at 12:30 PM
2. Opening Ceremonies – National Anthem and Guam Hymn
3. Introduction of Guests – Jerrick Hernandez and Gopinath Ramakrishnan
4. Approval of Minutes – April 2009 minutes tabled.
5. Treasurer's Report – For the month ended April 30, 2009, we have total assets of \$71,723 of which \$56,551 is Cash in Bank and \$15,172 in Accounts Receivable. For the eight months ended April 2009, we realized an overall increase in net assets of \$16,187.

The presentation was divided into three sections: a presentation of a UOG Centric Report, a presentation of a GCC Centric Report, and a presentation of a Case Study of the Guam Public School System. Dr. Crisostomo explained that the information contained in these reports were obtained directly from the institutions' website and that the students put it together in a report format.

Each presentation on the three different reports briefly explained the different sections of the report. Each report contained information such as the institution's mission statement and the goals. Within the report, information such as the student population statistics, graduation rates, performance indicators, financial information (obtained from the OPA website), etc. were included. In addition, current events affecting the institution and the future outlook were also included.

Doris Brooks commended the students for their hard work and excellent job well done.
